Animated Poetry

Activity

By creating animated poetry, students begin by drawing a self portrait. While drawing, students brainstorm on their own character strengths and use adjectives to describe themselves.

Objectives













- Students can generate and select ideas for writing and representing for a variety of purposes, audience, contexts and cultures.
- Students can use adjectives and describe a person's physical appearance, personality and feelings.
- Students can articulate and present their portrait poems to the group members.
- Students can speak clearly and fluently using the appropriate voice qualities – focus on stress.

Extensions

- Teacher to create placeholder within the template to scaffold each activity (from words to sentences to poem)
- Students can create a GIF instead of a video – to share their work.

Have a go



- 1 Tap , create a new Keynote presentation. Choose the white theme, add a blank slide to your Keynote presentation.
- 2 Tap  to insert a selfie photo. Select the inserted photo, tap  (style) to adjust the opacity to 20%. Use your Apple Pencil to tap on the screen to activate drawing, trace the photo. Or tap  on the top right hand corner, and under  and tap drawing to activate drawing.
- 3 Tap to select your sketch, **Animate** it using the  and then choose . Adjust duration and order accordingly.
- 4 Delete the photo after tracing. Use your Apple Pencil to write down the facts, characteristics of your new friend. Tap  on the top right hand corner, and under  Record Audio to verbalise and record explanation.
- 5 Tap  export to movie. Tap  to save video. Close Keynote and tap  to open your video in Photos.

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
