

Record Voice

Use Voice Memo to Record Voice

Activity

Students will use voice memo to record their voice in preparation before they proceed to incorporate other elements in GarageBand. This can help them to gauge their reading volume, whether there is a need to eliminate any background sounds, and other adjustments that may be necessary. They can also work on their reading speed and enunciation.

Objectives

Students will be able to

- Sing expressively with appropriate tempo, dynamics, articulation and phrasing
- Understand the role of music in society
- Generate ideas and explores different pathways to respond to an issue/challenge








Extensions

Students can

- Build on their music piece in GarageBand by including the use of other instruments
- Add their friends' voices
- Include soundscapes to personalize their music piece

Have a go



- 1 Open . Pause for 2 seconds before you start talking. Tap on  to begin recording. Pause for 2 seconds after you are done. Tap on  to stop recording.
- 2 Tap on  to listen to the recording. Check to ensure that the volume has been turned on so that you can listen to your recording.
- 3 Observe for your reading speed and enunciation. You can tap on Edit to trim the start or the end of the recording.
- 4 If there are mistakes in the middle of the recording, you will need to re-record it again. Be sure to listen to it and make sure that you are satisfied before you tap on Done.
- 5 Tap  and select Save to Files , then select On My iPad . Tap Save.
- 6 Long press on the recording name to rename it if you want to reuse it at a later date.

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
